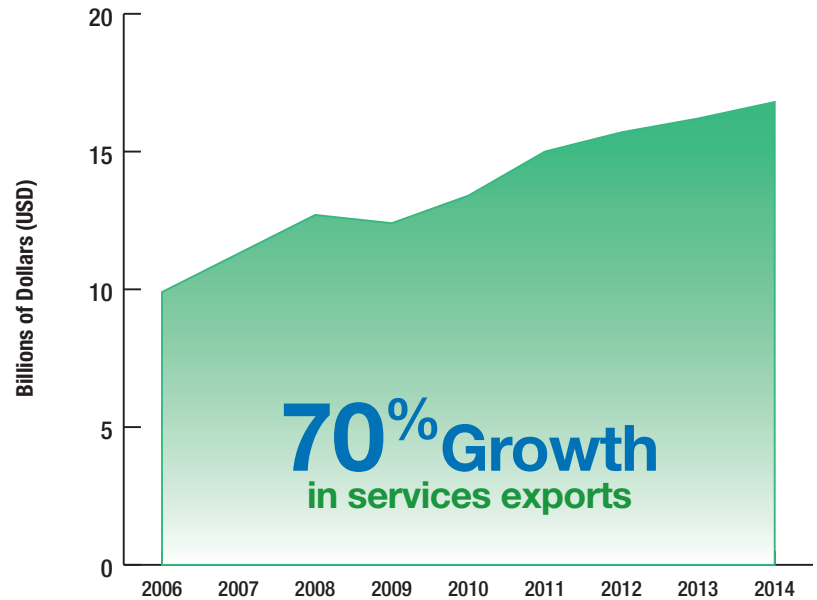
## U.S. Services Supply the World

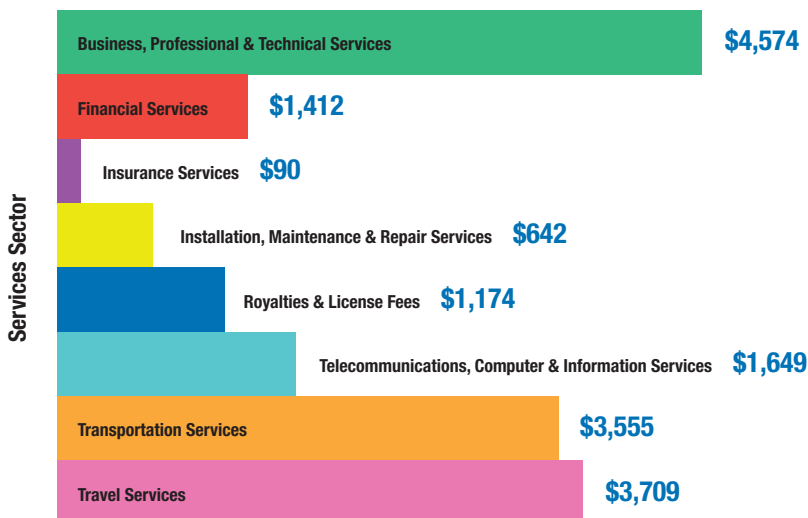
