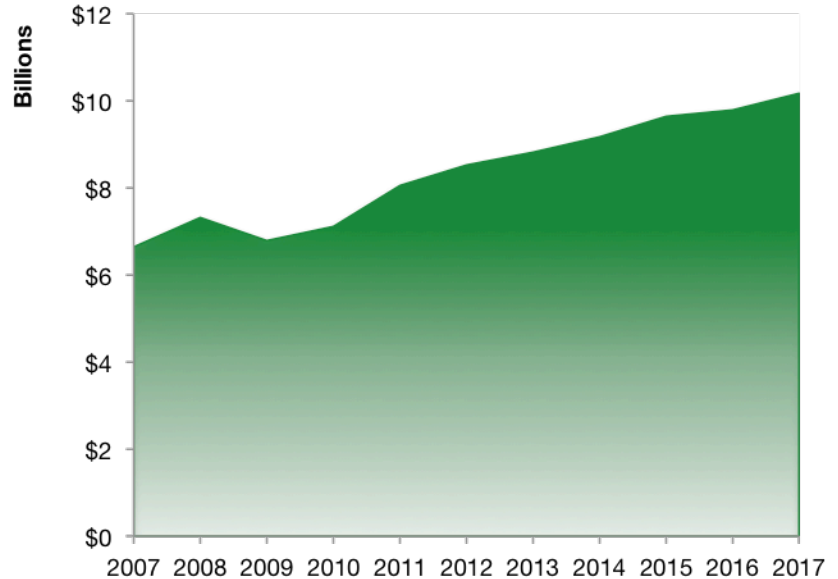
## Tennessee Services Exports

### U.S. Services Supply the World

Tennessee has seen a rise in overall services exports since 2007, boosting state economic growth and jobs, and contributing to the overall U.S. services trade surplus of \$248 billion in 2017.

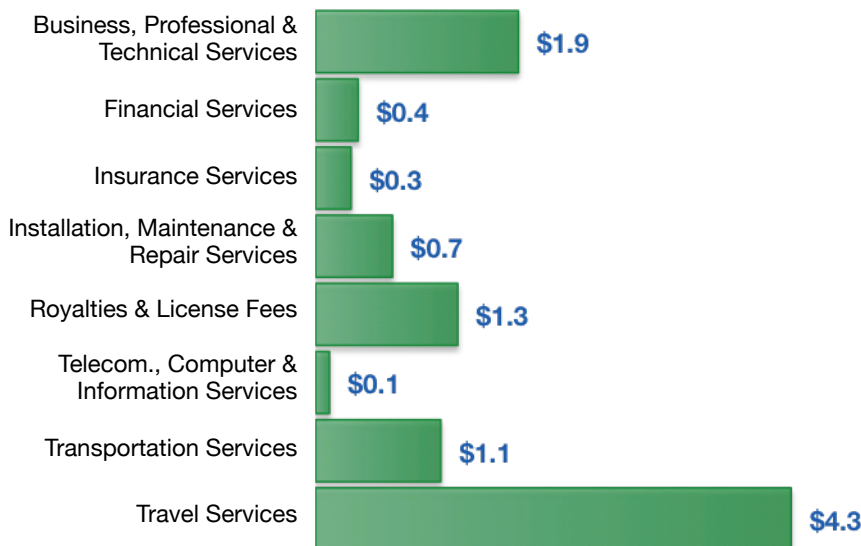

### Tennessee Services Exports to Select Countries, 2017

- To China:** \$789 million in services exports supporting 6,700 jobs
- To Canada:** \$868 million in services exports supporting 6,640 jobs
- To Mexico:** \$586 million in services exports supporting 5,120 jobs
- To Korea:** \$354 million in services exports supporting 2,810 jobs
- To Japan:** \$583 million in services exports supporting 4,400 jobs
- To EU:** \$2.1 billion in services exports supporting 15,500 jobs
- To UK:** \$950 million in services exports supporting 6,840 jobs

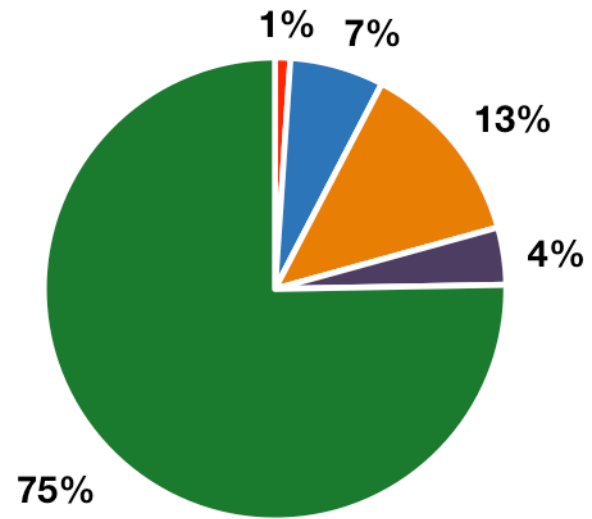

### Services Fuel U.S. Jobs and Growth

Services fuel America's economic growth and jobs, generating more than 77 percent of employment in the United States and 67 percent of GDP. Services are a major component of the manufacturing and agricultural sectors, and they boost the competitiveness of those sectors.

Services accounted for 75 percent of all jobs for Tennessee workers in 2017. The top services sector for employment was Education, Health Care, & Social Assistance, which alone employed 710,480 Tennessee workers.
